2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes :

From the first day itself the college starts functioning. Admission committee is formed to counsel the students in choosing their subjects. At the very outset the Academic Calendar is prepared by the IOAC. Regular classes are held as per the time table set by IQAC and timetable committee norms.

In all meetings the coordinator is invited as he/she is the effective bridge between the teaching faculty and the Principal and among the students.

Besides the academic calendar ,the students are informed via notice boards, social networks. Urgent information is announced on mike. Feedback is collected from students regarding all aspects of teaching.

In regular staff meetings the results are discussed and measures are taken to improve the performance of students. Create an environment where faculty is encouraged to teach with modern teaching aids. The qualified, experienced computer faculty extends training to the teachers with ICT teaching.

1. Title of the Practice

Guest lecture

2. Goal

Higher education today embraces the ideas of interdisciplinary thinking and performance. With Naac peer team's suggestions, the college realizes the importance of giving additional inputs to the students in the form of expert lectures in addition to academic knowledge being imparted during class room lectures.

Students are probably bored of our teaching methods and class. Guest lecturers will speak at a different pace, use different teaching aids and engage with students differently. Plus, it is an opportunity for students to interact with unfamiliar people and get comfortable talking to other adults-always a plus for networking down the road. Having another person teach a quick section of your class is a nice break for students-and it lends a different perspective.

Inviting guest lecturers has benefits for our learners. Learners of all ages and experience levels are hungry for variety and seeing a new face in front of the room can liven up the class. They speak on various important topics that would prove beneficial for them while choosing the right career paths.

3. The context

Students coming from rural areas have little knowledge about their subject. They are academically, economically poor. The school teaching is more of rote learning for students. To create their interest in extra activity besides academic demands a lot of time. Students have no communication skills, presentation skills, command on language. So, we have been arranging to invite guest lecturers in every subject, CWDC, NSS, Saptadhara, Placement cell.

When the college organises any program ,the students conduct them. Prayer, vote of thanks, verbal welcome are done by them. In such a program their stage fear, poor language, poor presentation skill is seen. Their pronunciation is very weak. In NSS, NCC, CWDC, Sports, Cultural activities orientation program is held to boost their confidence. 'Know your College' function is held to guide them about

timetable, subject, other activities. Every year 5th September is celebrated in our college and classes are conducted by the students. Counselling sessions are held to make them participate in these activities. Few students take the challenge of being a teacher. A part of syllabus is taught by them, they commit many mistakes but they are inspired and full of enthusiam. For the students it is a nice break from everyday monotonous lecture. These experts can be faculty from other institution (but perhaps outside of our department or college) or experts from the community. Students are learners. Their teachers are their role-models. They follow what the teachers tell them.

4 The Practice

Eminent speakers from the top are invited to impart best educational light and enlighten our students with their ideas and experiences they share with us.NSS held lecture on "Aids Awareness" to make people aware of aids.NSS annual camp was organized in Narsanda. Everyday in the noon session experts were invited to deliver lectures on Deaddiction, Save Girl Child, Superstition, Ethical Values. To empower girls CWDC was formed in every college. It held lectures on Career Development and Counselling, Social and Economic Empowerment, Opportunities of Employment in Technical Field. Many students were benefitted from this lectures.

As per KCG norms Udisha Club was formed to guide the students in their career, personality development, job oriented workshop and competitive exams. An expert lecturer was invited to deliver a lecture on how to prepare for bank, railway, and GPSC exams. It also held a lecture on 'Financial Planning for young investors.' To develop the students' overall personality training was given to them on Hastakala Art Japanese Art. A lecture was organised on Management Course.

The college offers seven principal subjects and one subsidiary subject. English, Gujarati, Hindi, Economics, Psychology, Politics are offered as main subjects and Sanskrit as subsidiary subject. In Hindi department Premchand Jayanti was celebreted on 31st July and an expert scholar was invited on that auspicious occasion. Not only the students of Hindi department but other students also enjoyed his lecture. Hindi Day was celebrated by the Principal, professors and students and a lecture was organised to explain the importance of the national language. The students also presented their papers to share their views on this language. This lecture ended with poetry recitation. The lecture was very fruitful and motivating for the students.

An inspiring lecture was organised in Sanskrit department. The Principal, professors and students also enjoyed this lecture and there was a session for question answer.

In the same way even Economics department organised a lecture on population explosion and its global impact for the students of social sciences and its video was shown to the students. This lecture was inspiring not only for students but also to the professors .Psychology department also invited scholar to deliver lecture on 'Psychology and Health' .This lecture was informative for psychology students, but it

was more informative for the professors. Sociology department also arranged lecture on 'Sociology of Gujarat'. The students conducted this program and participated in it.

Even professors of our college are also invited as guest lecturers in other colleges. When women empowerment week was celebrated in our college our professors expressed their views on women empowerment.

5. Evidence of Success

The Principal of this college is a Ph.d guide. He is also invited in other colleges and universities as an expert lexturer. Other professors offer their services as a guest lecturer.

Well equipped audio visual hall-Guest lectures are delivered here.

Well equipped library-The readership has increased in the library. Teachers and students make more use of reference books.

Because of inviting guest lecturers students' strength has increased in the class. Their perception is changed. Their communication skill, presentation skill has improved. Their command on the language has increased. Their participation in other activities has increased. Students become aware of multimedia.

Students participate in seminars and present their papers in different colleges. Their participation in debate, elocution, extempore is improving. They write articles, poems, and are published in college magazine' Sankalp'. Each department held seminar and 70% students participated in it. They presented their papers on different subjects. In some departments seminar continued for two days.

Our is a reputed college in Kheda district. It gains its popularity by organizing such activities which is reflected in the admission seekers who flock from surrounding areas. The learners come from distant areas of Kheda district.

College receives appreciation from parents, alumni association and even management. A strong closeness has developed between students and teachers. First they are inspired by the teachers to attend lectures. Such kind of activity inspires students to read more and it increases their visit to library. Teachers lend their personal books to students.

Management and Alumni association also took notice of this practice. They appreciated college for holding this activity and gave their consent to help college financially.

But the best appreciation is from parents side. They insist on holding these activities again and again.

6.Problems Encountered and Resources Required

College has to hold any activity in the morning because students are commuters they have to catch their buses. They leave college after three lectures. It is a real challenge. Classes are left to attend guest lecture. They are acclimatized with only rote teaching, chalk and duster methods. They have no idea about computer and other ITC methods.

To keep pace with digital development it has to be updated off and on with all security measures. The campus is wifi enabled and off and on facing disconnection problem.

Absence of a permanent Librarian makes many things difficult.

1 Title of the Practice

Students' Seminar

2.Goal

The aim to carry out this practice is to bring out the hidden ability of the students which can be moulded by such practice. Further such activity enhances students' communication skills .Lack of communication skills hamper their growth. Coming from rural areas they have no presentation skills and are full of stage fear.

Students are learners. Their teachers are their role models. They learn what they are taught. Such activity boosts their confidence, develop their personality, and enables the students to become a responsible citizen. The rural knowledge seekers become more efficient in academic as well as extra curricular activities.

3. The Context

As we have students coming from quite poor backgrounds (academically,economically), there is little support and awareness from their families to pursue studies to attain good percentage. They study to earn a degree sans 100% focus on studies. It is difficult to convince them to participate in a seminar. Class is only a means for them to hear their professors and taking notes. Most of them are commuters. Such activity can be held only in the morning. After three lectures they leave college. Councelling sessions are held for them and are guided by the teachers to take part in this activity. It is an innovative practise adopted by this college for student learning. It is a break from the daily, continuous lectures. Encouraging students' participation in activities facilitates developing various skills and competencies and foster holistic development.

4. The Practice

Students' seminar conducted by all departments

The Head of the department of Economics, Politics, Psychology, Sociology, Hindi, Gujarati, English, Sanskrit organised departmental seminars in Audio visual hall. First they are encouraged and counselled by the teachers to read a paper. They used the library and internet for reference books. Sem. I,III,V students participated in it. In every departments 70% students participated in it. Even the organization of the whole program was given to them. They did prayer, welcome, floral welcome, vote of thanks, paper presentation, announcement of results etc. They chose different topics in different subjects and each paper threw light on some new area. In some departments, seminar continued for two days and each seminar ended with question answer session and recital of national anthem. Questions were raised by

some students and answers were also satisfactory. Best three papers were selected in each subject and they were felicitated by the Principal.

Even in the classroom students are encouraged to speak on any topic for 2 or 3 minutes.

Whenever there is any function in our college prayer, anchoring, vote of thanks, are always managed by the students of the college.

Gyan dhara held competition like debate, elocution and students participated in it.

Students also participated in seminar held in sister institutions and even different colleges and presented papers.

5. Evidence of Success

As a result of conducting students' seminar ,the strength of the students in the class is increasing. First it was decided that Sem vi students would take part in it, but slowly sem II and IV students became enthusiastic.

Counselling sessions were held and students were guided by the teachers to participate in a seminar .Some of them spoke on the topic orally .Each student tried to be different from other.

Teaching, non-teaching staff, and even management, alumni association appreciated this practise of the college. The Principal also announced that the students' papers would be compiled and edited in the form of a book. The best thing is that the students' parents' also took notice of this and insisted on holding this kind of activity again and again. This practise helps in developing bond with parents. Students are now avid readers and make more use of the library books. Their articles and poems are published in college magazine Sankalp. A closeness has developed between students and teachers. Students often consult their teachers without hesitation.

The management and alumni association felicitated the Principal and teachers for the extraordinary activities held by them.

This college has gained reputation by holding such activities which is seen in the admission seekers who flock from surrounding areas.
