Being a very renowned institute in Kheda district, the college has its own career counseling and Udisha Placement cell. We realized that the students coming from rural areas having very sharp mind but don't have any awareness about the options available to them. After completing their graduation students hardly have educated, rich motivating family background where parents and families can guide them to choose their careers.

This cell has been working since 2010 for all those students who are interested in making their careers. Experts counsel them socially, psychologically, educationally and for their professional life. Regularly students use books, Periodicals, Newspaper. Different committees are working in this direction. They are exam committee, student union committee, and cultural committee, collegiate women development cell, Time Table committee, career and placement cell, nature club. The admission committee is formed to counsel the students in choosing their subjects. On the first day of the college 'Know Your College 'function is held and the students are acquainted with different activities and different committees working for them. They are counseled to participate in NCC, NSS or Sports. Before the celebration of 'Teachers Day' Students wishing to be teachers on this day are counseled by the teachers for their role.

Under Udisha placement cell and career counseling cell we held the lectures on these topics "Career Guidance' 'Career Counseling' 'Employment -Opportunities' 'Digital India'

In all the above lectures experts were invited to address them to remove their stage fear, exam fear to enhance their communication skills presentation skills, where to apply for placement, different websites. Many students are appearing in different competitive exams. The students from remote and rural areas have been benefitted by this cell and become well mannered and polite by personality development . There is positive feedback from the students . The students are finding their future and career through this cell.

#### 2. Departmental Activities of Economics Department

Since college is a place which provides platform to unearth students hidden skills. Besides teaching in a traditional way, faculties teach by using modern technology. For that seven classes on top floor are equipped with smart boards .The whole campus is wi-fi enabled. .All departments are provided with laptops and in all the seven classrooms they use their materials through pen drive or internet .The college has dell laboratory where the students learn the basic skills of language learning listening, Speaking and writing.

It is decided that every department should organize activities for the students growth. Economics department held interclass seminar ,Quiz Competition ,Co operation training, guest lecture ,Academic tour organized by co-operation training ,academic tour organised by tourism course ,food distribution in civil Hospital patients.

To increase the students general Knowledge, Quiz competition was organised 30 students from Sem I, Sem-III,Sem-V (The whole 10 teams ) took part in it. When it started, the Head of Economics dept.Prof.R.B.Saksena explained the rules of this competition. Out of ten teams, three teams won. Each student was awarded with a certificate with a view to encouraging them and winner teams were awarded with cash prize and certificates .The principal and other professors congratulated the students and the whole teams effort.

- Interclass seminar on 'population explosion: A global challenge was organised and turn by turn each student from sem 1,III and V expressed his views on this topic.
- Gujarat State cooperation group Ahmadabad and Kheda district cooperation group Nadiad conjointly organised cooperation teaching training class for a week. Class organiser shri Jaydipbhai patel invited experts to make this training more interesting and motivating. Nearly sixty trainers took part in this training.
- Keeping in mind the students employment opportunities after graduation department lectures were organised on banking and employment opportunities. Thease lectures concluded with question answer session. These lectures were thought provoking and informative for the students of economics department.
- Academic tour was organised by cooperation teaching training class to ghandhinagar science city, Akshardham and Adaljni vav. The students of social sciences took part in it. This tour was motivated by the presence of the principal vice-principal, Prof.Vaghela and Hiral Suthar.

,Div,Somnath and Bhalkatirth was organised and nearly sixty students of the three courses joined this tour.Prof.Saxena sir,Prof.Kalpnaben ,Prof.Arpitaben also participated in this tour.

Faculties of social sciences and students visited civil hospital and distributed fruit among poor patients.
